NEW FAMILIES

Welcome to St. Bernadette Parish! To register in the parish, please email Deacon Tom Fitzpatrick at <u>deacontom@stbl.org</u>. He will get back to you to arrange a convenient time to meet with him to register. We are eager to greet new members of our parish community and look forward to meeting you.

RECTORY OFFICE HOURS

The rectory office hours are Monday through Friday from 9:00am to noon and 1:00pm to 5:00pm. During the summer the rectory will close at 3:00pm on Fridays. Items for the Sunday newsletter must be at the rectory by Monday at noon for publication the following Sunday.

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are held at 12 noon on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month. Parents must attend a Pre-Jordan class held in the Wright Center at 12 noon on the first Sunday of every other month (please refer to the bulletin for exact dates). Registration for the class is required. In order to arrange for a baptism, the parents must be active members of the parish for six months. To register, please call the rectory office at 610/789-7676. Godparents should be practicing Catholics, confirmed and at least 16 years of age. If not from this parish, sponsors must have a letter of eligibility from their parish stating that they have been actively participating for six months. St. Bernadette Parishioners must be registered and actively participating for six months to receive a letter of eligibility.

MARRIAGES

We request that couples contemplating marriage call the rectory to make an appointment with the priest. At this initial interview, the date and time of your request will be recorded and you will receive a copy of the Parish Wedding Guidelines.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/COMMUNION CALLS

A priest will administer Holy Communion to parishioners who are unable to come to Church. If you desire, Eucharistic Ministers can bring Communion each week. Please contact the Rectory to be placed on our Sick List. Parishioners who are to undergo serious surgery at a hospital are encouraged to make an appointment at the Rectory before going to the hospital.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

St. Bernadette School offers sessions for Pre-School and Kindergarten and conducts full-time classes from first through eighth grades. PREP classes are held in the parish school for all students attending public school. PREP classes are held on Monday evenings at 6:45pm. - Bequests can include a specific dollar amount, assets, securities, real estate, insurance polices, IRAs and personal property.

- Real estate bequests may include the entirety or remainder of your estate after payment of expenses and any specific amounts designated to other beneficiaries.

PALM SUNDAY

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Scholars of the Scriptures warn us not to be taken in by Hollywood recreations of the Passion events in terms of crowd size. The streets of old Jerusalem, which I have been privileged to walk, were narrow to the point that we might call them "alleys." The procession of Our Lord that wound up and down them on the way to Calvary would hardly have to attract many people to be called "a crowd." This not to ignore the real crowds that had followed Him during the years of His missionary days.

We twenty-first century followers of Christ, who follow in His path know that crowd size hardly matters. We know enough about Jesus to build our lives upon Him. We number in the billions. No matter the number of times we hear Mark's gospel, it never loses its punch and power.

Some years ago there was a popular song derived from a movie with the vapid lyric: "Love means never having to say 'I'm sorry'." What an empty definition when placed against the scenes of Our Lord's final hours! He shows us more than what loves looks like. He shows us love. St. John went further when he wrote "God is love."

Good Friday preachers struggle to say something new about its implications and are often bereft of the right words. All they can really do is stare in shock at what human hate can produce against its target and remind us of God showing us what love can do for the beloved. We are the beloved in this case, and our often shameful indifference is embarrassing to say the least.

All this becomes personal when we realize that our sins had a part to play in this unique tragedy. Our ugly response to God at times is what held the whips that lacerated His back. Our overdrawn egos drove the thorns into His holy Head. Our gross ingratitude hammered the nails into His hands and feet. Our vulgar voices did the shouting at Him. Our vincible ignorance spat at Him. Somehow we push all that aside when we willfully sin.

In the end, the size of the original group of onlookers that witnessed all this doesn't matter. That His Mother Mary was among them causes that ache in our throats that leads to tears. That His aunts and the youngest Apostle were there, gives our side a tiny morale boost. But the absence of the other Eleven shames us. But we really must admit that "we were there when they crucified Our Lord." Only His divine mercy makes us eligible for pardon.

So, as we begin Holy Week 2021, the call goes out to be a people who pause to think and remember why all these mostly ugly events happened. And if we need words, we have those of our great St. Francis of Assisi: "We adore you O Christ and we bless You, because by Your holy Cross You have redeemed the world."

God love you and give you His peace.
